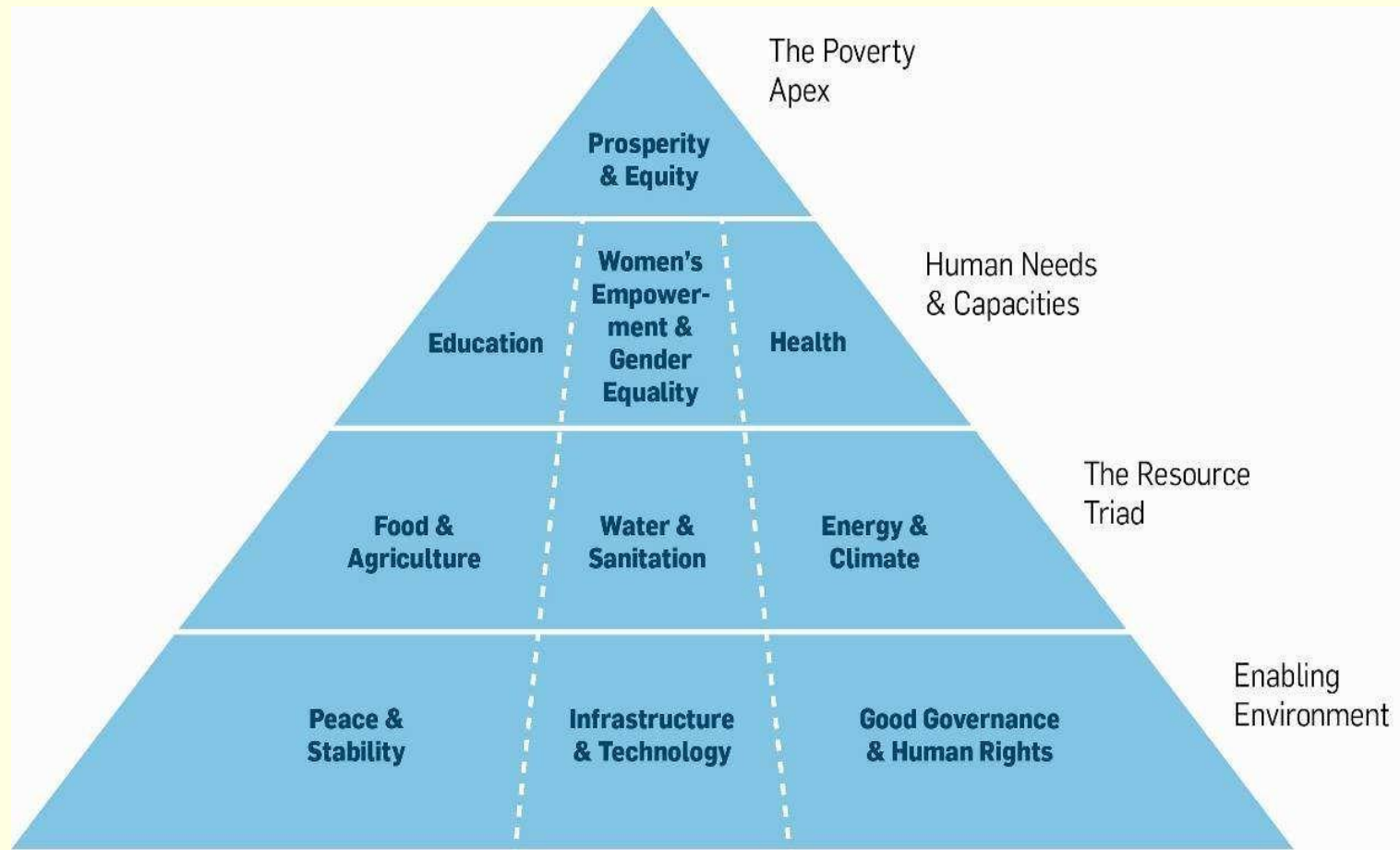

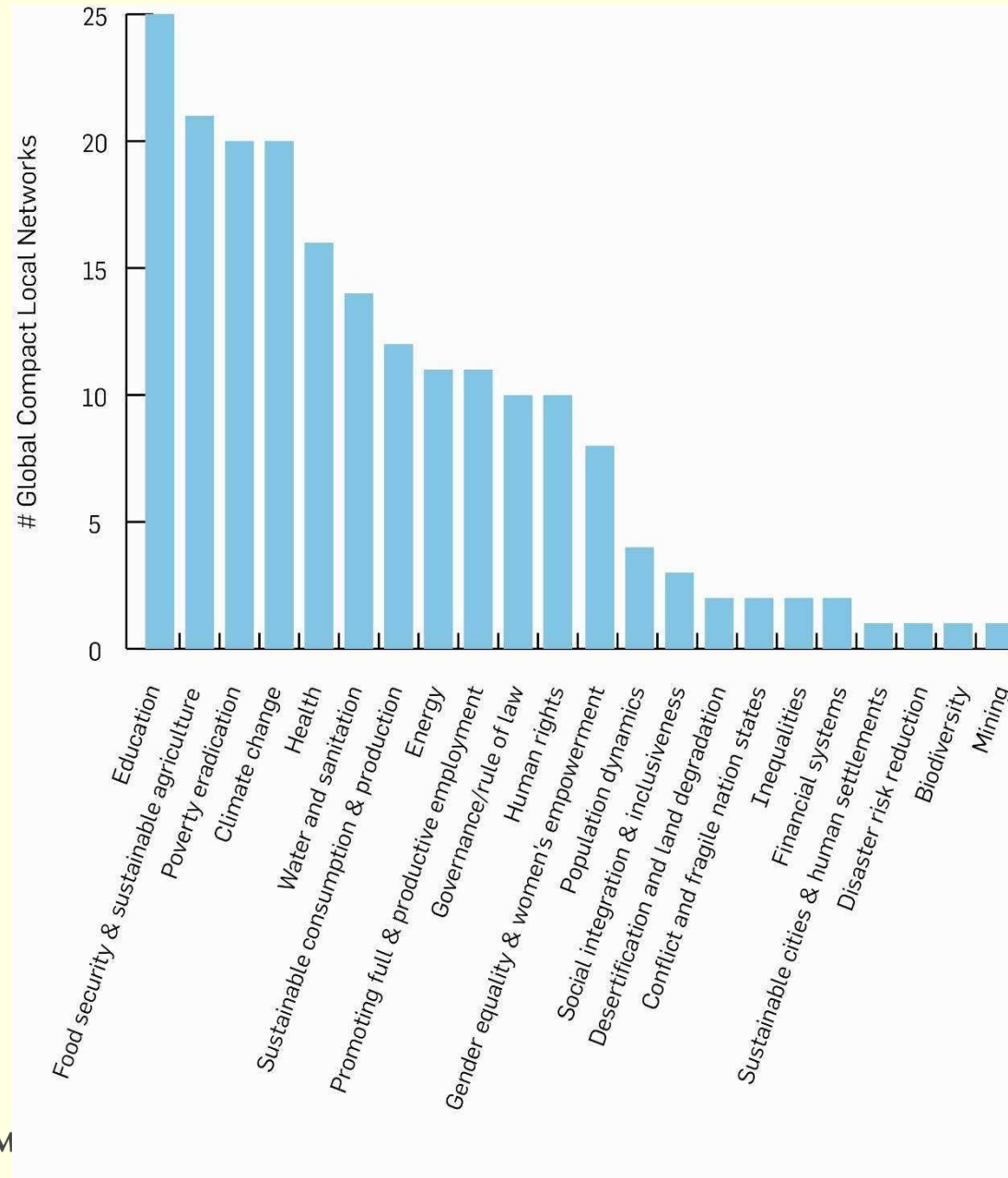

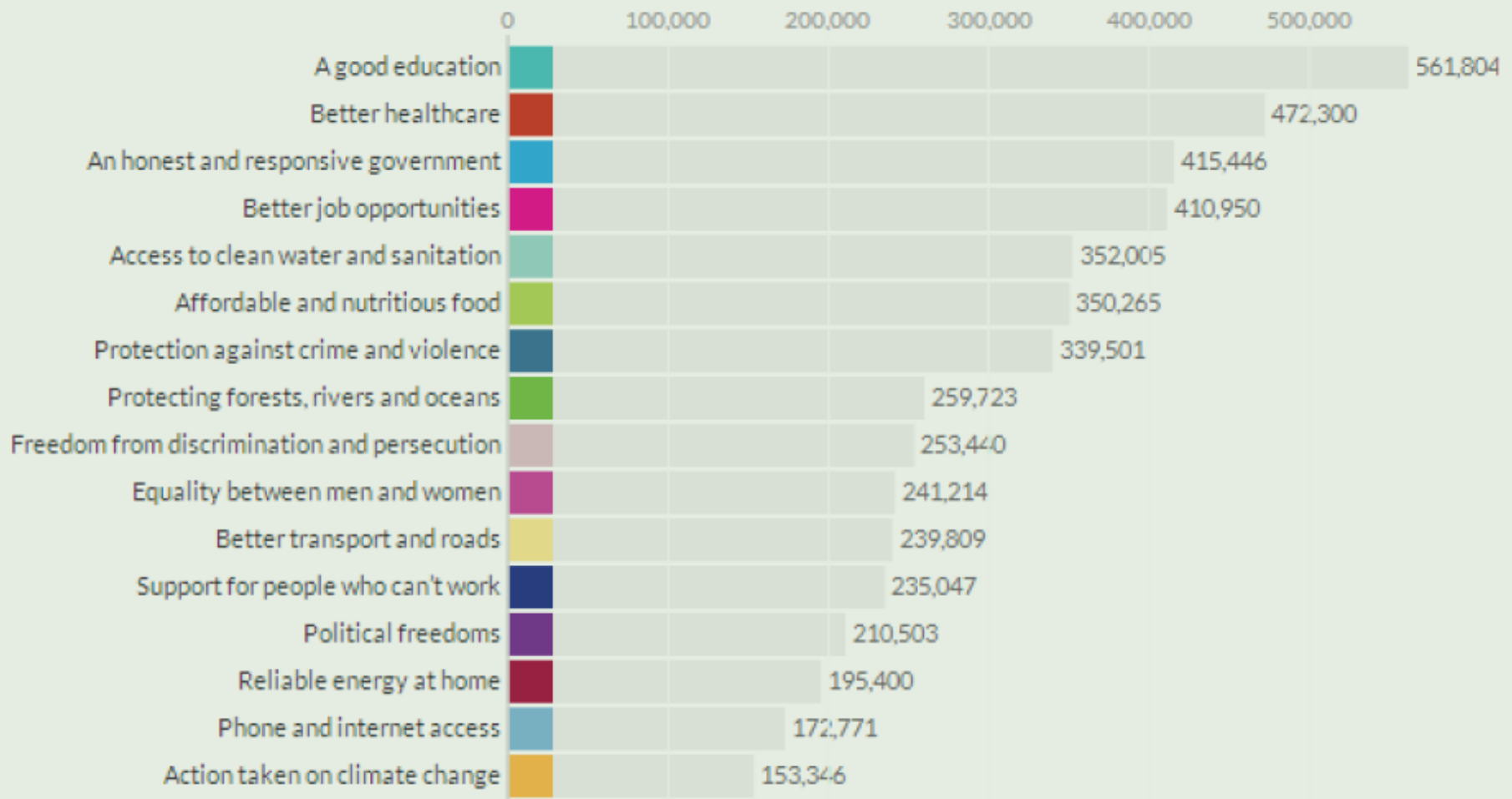
# Which areas of action should be the top priority for the world?

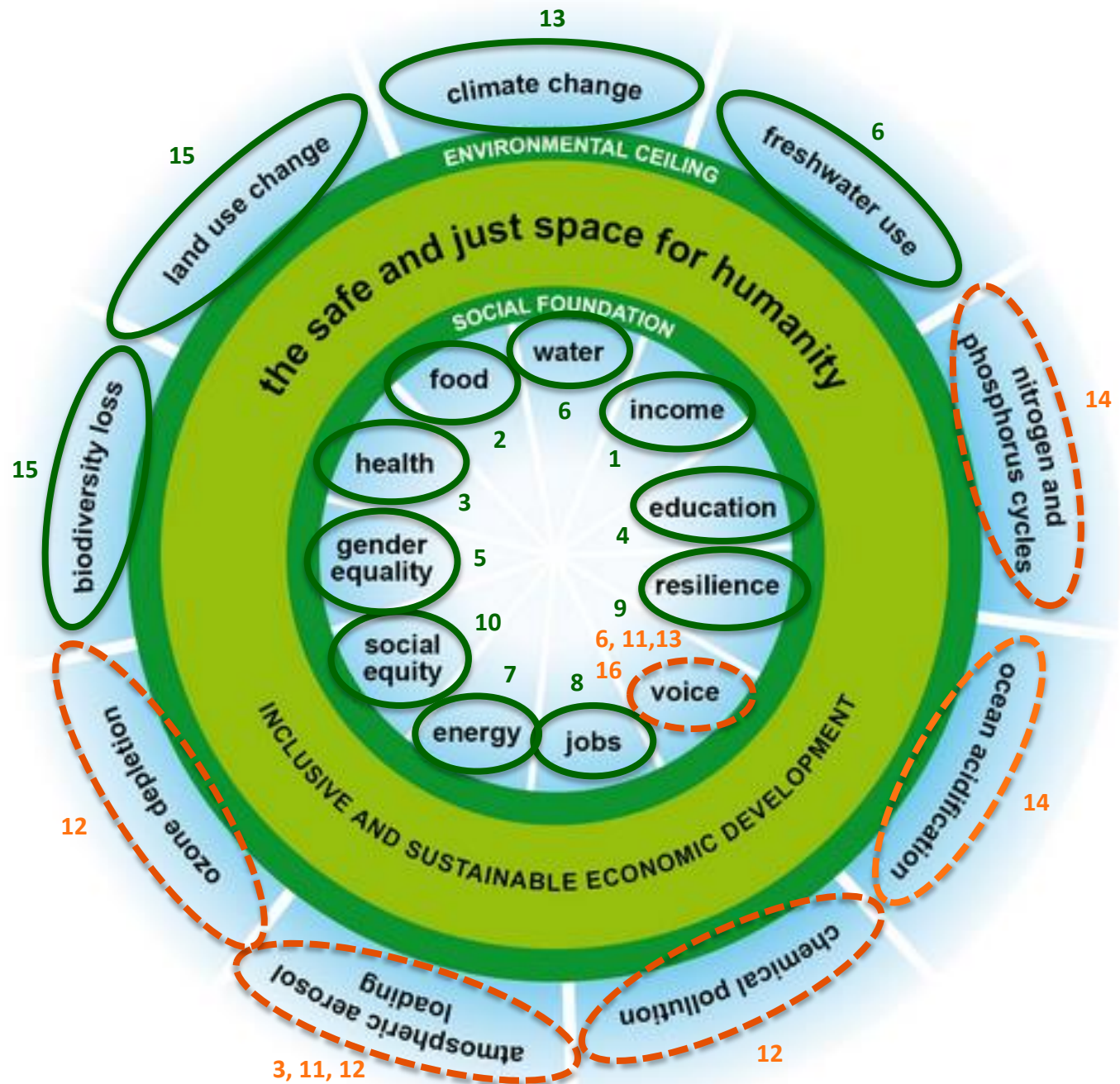

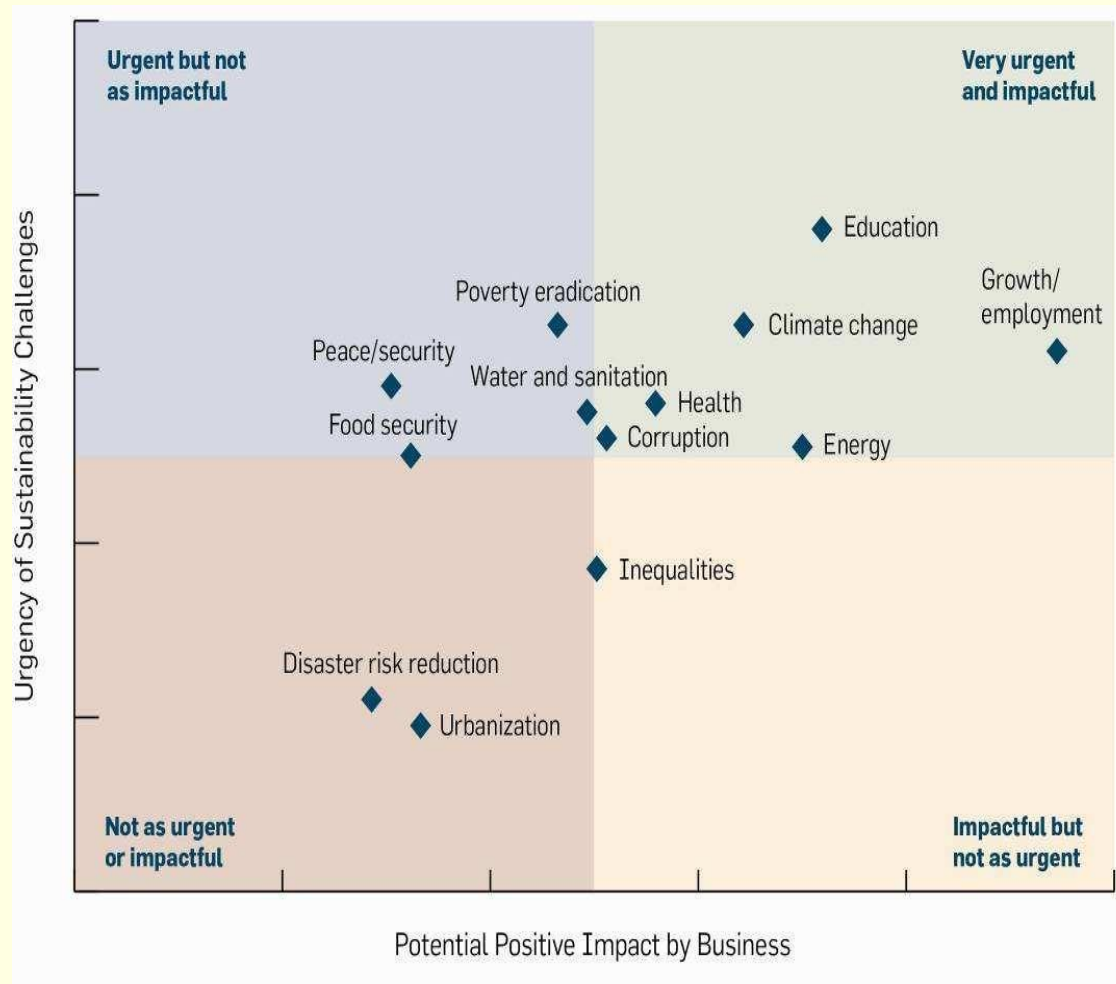

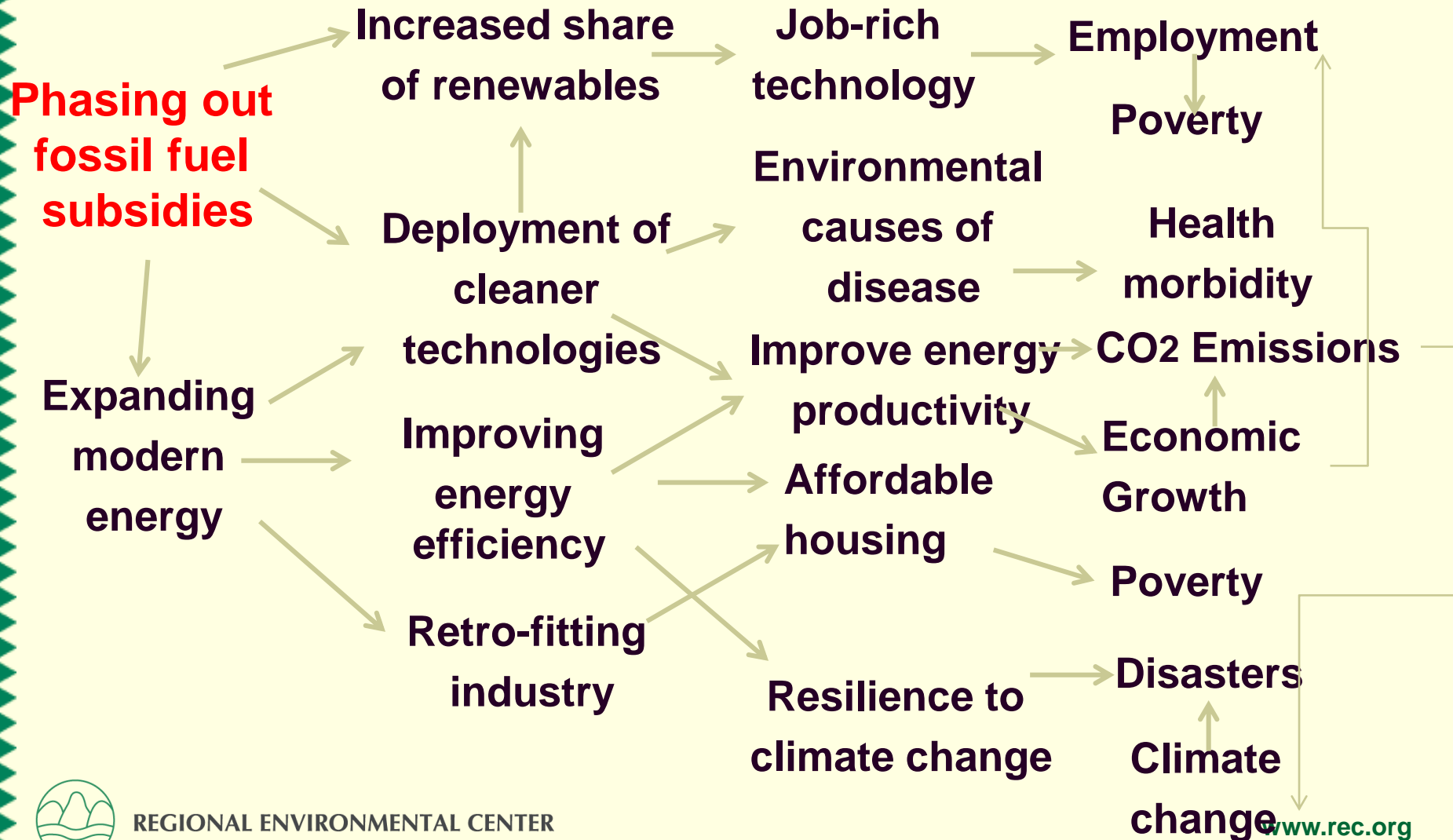
